#### 2012 | 2013 HIGHLIGHTS

#### Strategic Planning

Currently, the Board of Directors is in the midst of a 5 year Strategic Plan which has a focal point on the emerging needs of the community. As we look to the future, we are committed to exploring new innovative programs to adapt to the evolving needs of the community.

#### Community Palliative Care Awareness

Palliative Care Awareness in our community is top of mind for us. Providing resources for patients, caregivers and healthcare professionals involved with end-of-life care in Burlington is always a priority. By encouraging and enabling open dialogue, information exchange and service provision we hope to enhance quality of life for individuals facing the last stages of life.

Communications surrounding the intake process, residential care, and available programs at the Carpenter Hospice are managed through on-going engagement with representatives from the surrounding community working in palliative care: doctors, nurses, case managers, CCAC, and families managing their loved one's palliative care. The Carpenter Hospice team works collectively to generate awareness for the hospice and our services throughout the Burlington community.

#### Kitchen & Dietary Coordinator Role

The Dietary Services Program is managed by the Dietary & Kitchen Coordinator, a new role that took effect in November of 2012. The purpose of the Dietary Services Program at the Carpenter Hospice is to provide meals for the residents, snacks for families and visitors, and light refreshments for our Wellness and Bereavement programs. The kitchen in the hospice is manned by a team of dedicated volunteers from 9:00 am to 7:30 pm over 3 shifts daily. The Carpenter Hospice also offers nutrition support and counseling for residents, program participants, family members and shift workers.

#### Volunteer Training

The Palliative Care Training Course continues to be offered to current and new volunteers of the Carpenter Hospice. To date, a total of 103 volunteers and staff members have completed the course.

Mandatory National Food Safety Certification was introduced at the end of 2012 to all of the kitchen volunteers. To date, 36 volunteers on the kitchen team have received their certification.

#### New Logo

The Carpenter Hospice logo borrows from our past and in a very ethereal way, addresses our future. Since our inception, the Carpenter Hospice has used the image of a butterfly in our mark. It was a wonderful choice, since throughout history the butterfly has been thought of as an uplifting symbol of life and hope.

In our new logo, unveiled in September of 2012, the butterfly has been given more movement by its position in mid-flight. A closer look at the edge of the wings reveals four facial silhouettes representing four facets of the Carpenter Hospice - Our residents and their families, our staff, our volunteers, and our community.

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
